Delmont Cleanup Continues

PIERRE, S.D. – Cleanup continues in Delmont as citizens and volunteers clear away debris caused by the May 10 tornado.

Damaged structures, including some homes, are being taken down. Heavy machinery is being used in some projects. Debris continues to be hauled to the Douglas County rubble site.

City officials want to thank all of the volunteers and organizations for their assistance. Financial donations still are being accepted at the First State Bank in Delmont, Tripp, Geddes and Armour where a fund has been established.

Volunteers also are still needed. The Volunteer Center, which is currently being managed by Lutheran Social Services, is open 8 a.m.-7 p.m. every day at the baseball field located at the south end of the community. Those volunteering are asked to come into Delmont on Highway 18.

The Donations Management Center, located at the Delmont American Legion Hall, is open from 8 a.m.-6 p.m. every day.
